Overview

Use the application to create custom slide shows that appear on the printer display. You can specify how long each slide appears. You can load images from a flash drive or using the Embedded Web Server.

Configuring the application

Make sure that an image does not exceed 128KB. To fit an image in the display, resize the image to the correct size:

- For printers with a 4.3-inch display, images must be 480 x 270 pixels.
- For printers with a 7- or 10-inch display, images must be 800 x 480 pixels.

Accessing the configuration page for the application

1 Open a Web browser, and then type the printer IP address.

Note: View the IP address in the TCP/IP section of the Network/Ports menu.

2 Click **Settings** or **Configuration**.

3 Depending on your printer model, do one of the following:

- Click **Apps > Apps Management**.
- Click **Device Solutions > Solutions (eSF)**.
- Click **Embedded Solutions**.

4 Select the application from the list, and then click **Configure**.

Setting up the application to use a flash drive

1 Create a folder in your flash drive containing the images you want to use.

2 From the Embedded Web Server, access the configuration page for the application.

3 From the USB Drive Settings section, select **Enable USB Drive**.

4 From the Directory Path text box, type the name of the image file folder you created in the flash drive.

5 If necessary, from the Slide Show Settings section, adjust more settings.

Note: For more information on each setting, see the mouse-over help.

6 Apply the changes.

Creating a slide show using the Embedded Web Server

1 From the Embedded Web Server, access the configuration page for the application.

2 From the Showroom Slides section, add, edit, or delete an entry.

Notes:

- An entry without an image cannot be used in the slide show.
- To change the interval between slides, select **Override Global Interval**.

3 Apply the changes.

Note: You can adjust more settings from the Slide Show Settings section. For more information on each setting, see the mouse-over help.

Using the application

Running a slide show

Notes:

- Before using the application, make sure to configure the slide show settings. For more information, see [“Configuring the application” on page 4](#).
- The application can use images from a flash drive or uploaded in the Embedded Web Server. If the application is configured for both, then images from the flash drive are used.

Running a slide show from a flash drive

- 1 Insert the flash drive into the USB port of your printer.

Note: For more information, see the printer *User’s Guide*.

- 2 From the home screen, touch **Showroom**. Images appear in alphabetical order.

Notes:

- You can remove the flash drive after the slide show starts, but the images are not stored in the printer. If the slide show stops, then insert the flash drive again to view the images.
- To store images in the printer, use the Embedded Web Server. For more information, see [“Creating a slide show using the Embedded Web Server” on page 4](#).

Running a slide show from the Embedded Web Server

From the home screen, touch **Showroom**. Images appear in the order in which they are listed in the configuration page for the application.

Note: An entry without an image cannot be used in the slide show.

Troubleshooting

Error reading the flash drive

Make sure that the flash drive is compatible with the printer

The minimum requirements are the following:

- USB 2.0
- Full Speed standard
- Type A connector
- Formatted for the FAT file system

For more information on supported flash drives, see the printer *User's Guide*.

Nothing happens when the flash drive is inserted

Make sure that the USB ports on the printer are enabled

For more information, contact your administrator.

Image does not appear

Try one or more of the following:

Make sure that the image does not exceed the maximum file size

For more information, see the mouse-over help.

Make sure that an image file is uploaded when adding an image for the slide show

Make sure that the directory path to the images in the flash drive is correct

Image size exceeds the limit

Make sure that the image does not exceed the maximum file size

Appendix

Exporting or importing a configuration file

- 1 From the Embedded Web Server, access the configuration page for the application.
- 2 Export or import the configuration file.

Notes:

- If a **JVM Out of Memory** error occurs, then repeat the export process until the configuration file is saved.
- If a timeout occurs and a blank screen appears, then refresh the Web browser, and then click **Apply**.

Licensing applications

Applications require an electronic license to run on some printers.

- 1 From the Embedded Web Server, click **Reports > Device Settings**.
- 2 In the Embedded Solutions section, note the value associated with “Framework =.”
