Front cover	Install or change print cartridges.Clear paper jams.

Paper guide and release tab	Adjust the paper guide against the left edge of the paper to make sure paper feeds correctly into the printer.
Paper support	Keep paper straight in the sheet feeder.

Power supply	Supply power to the printer.
Sheet feeder	Feed plain or specialty paper automatically. For information about the amount of paper you can load, see Printing ideas .

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Understanding the printer software

Your printer software works with your operating system to print documents with superior results. This software has two parts: the **Printer driver** and the **Lexmark Solution Center**.

Printer driver

The driver is where you change your printer settings. To print a typical document on plain paper, you do not need to change your printer settings. When you installed the printer software, the Page Setup dialog box and the Print dialog box were set to the default settings. The default settings are:

- Quality/Speed: Normal
- Type: Plain paper
- Paper Size: A4 or Letter
- Orientation: Portrait
- Style: Normal

Customizing the settings for your document

- 1 From the desktop, open your printer driver by typing lexmarkz13 or lexmarkz23z33 at a command line. You can also select the file using the file manager.
- 2 From the Printer Settings tab, select the tab that contains the settings you want to change: Quality/Copies tab, Paper Setup tab, and Print Style tab.
- **3** Click OK to apply your settings.

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Step 1: Load the paper

You can load up to 100 sheets of plain paper at a time, depending on the thickness of the paper.

1 Place the paper against the right side of the paper support with the print side facing you.

Note: The top of your A4 size paper should extend above the top of the paper support. (Letter size paper should align with the top of the paper support.)

2 Squeeze the release tab and the paper guide together. Slide the paper guide to the left edge of the paper.

For information about loading specialty paper, see **Printing** ideas.



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Step 2: Customize the print settings

If you are using plain, A4 or letter size paper, and you want normal print quality and speed, you don't need to adjust the print settings.

If you are using specialty paper, such as photo paper, card stock, envelopes, or banner paper, see **Printing ideas** to customize your print settings.

Step 3: Print your document

After you load the paper and customize the print settings, you are ready to print.

Printing from a software application

1 From the File menu, choose Print.

The Print dialog box opens.

2 Select your printer from the list of installed printers.

If the software application does not offer a list of printers, but provides a place to enter your printer name, type:

lpr -Pprintername
where printername = lexmarkz13 or lexmarkz23-z33.

3 Click Enter.

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Printing from an xterm window

- **1** Open an xterm window.
- 2 Type:

lpr -Pprintername filename
where printername = lexmarkz13 or lexmarkz23-z33 and filename = the name
of your file.

3 Click Enter.

- Make sure the glossy or coated side is facing you.
- Load the photo paper vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the paper too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the photo paper.



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Step 2: Customize the print settings

- **1** Select a print quality:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** From the Quality/Speed area, select Better or Best.

Note: Higher print quality settings result in better quality documents, but may take longer to print.

 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Photo/Glossy Paper or Coated Paper.
- 3 Choose a paper size:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.

- 4 Click OK to apply your settings.

Printing on premium paper

You can print up to 100 pages of premium paper at a time, depending on the thickness of the paper.

- If there is a special mark on the paper, make sure the mark is facing away from you.
- Load the paper vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the paper too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the paper.

- 1 Select a print quality:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** From the Quality/Speed area, select Better or Best.

Note: Higher print quality settings result in better quality documents, but may take longer to print.

 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Plain Paper.
- **3** Choose a paper size:

- Don't push the cards too far down into the sheet feeder. ٠
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the cards. ٠

 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** From the Quality/Speed area, select Normal or Better.



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- 2 Select a paper type:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Greeting Card.
- **3** Choose a paper size:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Paper Size menu, choose the correct size. For more information about printing on custom size paper, see **Printing on custom size paper**.
- 4 Click OK to apply your settings.

Step 3: Print your cards

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Printing envelopes

You can print up to 10 envelopes at a time, depending on the thickness of the envelopes.

Step 1: Load the envelopes

Note: Do not use envelopes with holes, windows, deep embossing, metal clasps, string ties, or folding bars.

- Make sure the print side is facing you. ٠
- Make sure the stamp is located in the upper left corner.
- Load the envelopes vertically against the right side of ٠ the paper support.
- Don't push the envelopes too far down into the sheet feeder. ٠
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the envelopes. ٠



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Step 2: Customize the print settings

- **1** Select a paper type:
 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Envelope.
- 2 Choose an envelope size:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Envelope Size menu choose the correct size. For more information about printing on custom size paper, see **Printing on custom size paper**.
- **3** Select the orientation:
 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Orientation area, select Landscape.

 - **Note:** Many software applications are designed to override the settings in Paper Setup. Make sure Landscape orientation is also selected in your software application.

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Printing color images in black and white

You can print up to 100 sheets of paper at a time, depending on the thickness of the paper. Printing in black only helps to conserve ink in your color print cartridge.

Step 1: Load the paper

- Make sure the print side is facing you.
- Load the paper vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the paper too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the paper.



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Step 2: Customize the print settings

- **1** To print color images in black and white:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** Select Print Color Images in Black and White.

Note: This option is only available in the Lexmark Z23 and the Lexmark Z33 printer driver. Lexmark Z13 users print with black cartridge installed.

c Click OK.

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Printing labels

You can print up to 25 sheets of labels at a time, depending on the thickness of the sheets.

Step 1: Load the labels

- Use labels designed for inkjet printers.
- If your labels came with instructions, read them carefully.
- Do not print within 1 mm (0.04 in.) of the edge of a label.
- Make sure there are no missing or curled labels.
- Make sure the print side is facing you.
- Load the labels vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the labels too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the labels.

 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** From the Quality/Speed area, select Normal.

 - Length: 127 to 432 mm (5 to 17 in.)
- Make sure the print side is facing you.
- Load the paper vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the paper too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the paper.

- Make sure the print side (blank side) is facing you.
- Load the iron-on transfers vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the iron-on transfers too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the iron-on transfers.

- **1** Select a paper type:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Iron-on Transfer.
- **2** If your software application does not have mirror or iron-on settings, select a print style:

 - **b** From the Style area, select Mirror.
- **3** Click OK to apply your settings.

- Make sure the rough side (print side) of the transparencies is facing you. If the transparencies have a removable stripe, make sure each stripe is facing away from you and down.
- Load the transparencies vertically against the right side of the paper support. ٠
- Don't push the transparencies too far down into the sheet feeder. ٠
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the transparencies.

 - **b** From the Type area, select Transparency.
- **3** Choose a paper size:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Paper Size menu, choose A4 or Letter.
- 4 Click OK to apply your settings.


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Step 3: Print your transparencies

Note: To prevent smudging, remove each transparency as it exits the printer and let it dry before stacking.



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Printing your document in reverse order

You can print up to 100 sheets of paper at a time, depending on the thickness of the paper.

Step 1: Load the paper

- Make sure the print side is facing you.
- Load the paper vertically against the right side of the paper support.
- Don't push the paper too far down into the sheet feeder.
- Slide the paper guide to the left side of the paper.

- **1** To print the last page first:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
 - **b** Select Print Last Page First.
 - **c** Click OK.

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Printing a banner

You can print up to 20 sheets of banner paper at a time.

Step 1: Load the banner paper

- **1** Remove any paper from the sheet feeder.
- **2** Lower the top portion of the paper support halfway.
- **3** Place a stack of banner paper with *only* the number of sheets you need to print your banner behind the printer.

Note: Loading excess banner paper may cause a paper jam. For help, see The printer has a paper jam.

- 4 Load the leading edge of the first page into the sheet feeder with the right side against the paper support.
- **5** Slide the paper guide to the left edge of the paper.

- 1 Select a paper type:
 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Type area, select Banner.

Note: If you do not select Banner as the Type, your banner paper will cause a paper jam. For help, see **The printer has a paper jam**.

 - a From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Banner Size menu, choose A4 or Letter.
- **3** Select the orientation:
 - **a** From Printer Settings, choose the Paper Setup tab.
 - **b** From the Orientation area, select Portrait or Landscape.



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4 Select the Style:

a From Printer Settings, choose the Print Style tab.

- **b** From the Style area, select Banner.
- **5** Click OK to apply your settings.

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Replacing a print cartridge

Before you install a new or replacement print cartridge, remove the used one.

Removing the used cartridge

- 1 Make sure the Power light is on.
- 2 Raise the front cover.

The print cartridge carrier moves to the loading position, unless the printer is busy.

3 Remove the used print cartridge and store it in an airtight container or dispose of it properly. If you own a Lexmark Z13 printer, you can store the cartridge in the print cartridge storage unit, see Storing an extra print cartridge.





Installing the cartridge

For best results, use Lexmark supplies. Refilling cartridges can affect print quality and cause damage to the printer. Use part number 10N0016 to order a black cartridge, and part number 10N0026 to order a color cartridge.

- 1 If you are installing a new cartridge, remove the sticker and transparent tape from the back and bottom of the print cartridge.
 - Warning: Do not touch the gold contact areas on back and bottom of the print cartridge.
- **2** Click your printer name for instructions on installing the print cartridges:
 - Lexmark Z13

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Lexmark Z13

Your printer shipped with a color print cartridge (P/N 10N0026). You may also purchase a black cartridge (P/N 10N0016) seperately. For more information, see **Ordering supplies**.

Your printer uses one print cartridge at a time: either a black or a color cartridge.

To install a print cartridge:

- a Open the cartridge carrier lid.
- **b** Insert the print cartridge into the carrier.
- c Close the carrier lid completely.
- d Close the front cover. Continue with Selecting the cartridge in the software.









Note: To extend the life of your color print cartridge, print black and white documents with a black print cartridge.

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Your printer shipped with a color print cartridge (P/N 10N0026). You may also purchase a black cartridge (P/N 10N0016) separately. For more information, see **Ordering supplies**.

Your printer can print with one of the following cartridge configurations:

- · A color cartridge by itself in the left carrier
- A black cartridge by itself in the right carrier
- Both a color and a black cartridge

To install a print cartridge:

- a Open the cartridge carrier lid.
- **b** Insert the print cartridge into the carrier.
- c Close the carrier lid completely.
- d Close the front cover. Continue with Selecting the cartridge in the software.









Note: To extend the life of your color print cartridge and improve printing speed, install a black print cartridge along with the color cartridge.

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Your printer came with two print cartridges: a color cartridge (P/N 10N0026) and a black cartridge (P/N 10N0016).

Your printer can print with one of the following cartridge configurations:

- A color cartridge by itself in the left carrier
- A black cartridge by itself in the right carrier
- Both a color and a black cartridge

To install a print cartridge:

- a Open the cartridge carrier lid.
- **b** Insert the print cartridge into the carrier.
- c Close the carrier lid completely.
- d Close the front cover. Continue with Selecting the cartridge in the software.













Selecting the cartridge in the software

- 1 Open the Lexmark Solution Center. For help, see Lexmark Solution Center.
- **2** From the Cartridges tab, click Install/Change Cartridge.
- **3** Select the type of cartridge you installed.
- **4** Specify whether the cartridge is a new cartridge or an old cartridge (one that has been used before).
- 5 Click OK.
- 6 If you installed a new cartridge, continue with Aligning the print cartridges.

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Aligning the print cartridges

Normally, you align the print cartridges after installing or replacing a print cartridge. However, you may also need to align the print cartridges when:

- Characters are not aligned correctly at the left margin.
- Vertical lines appear "wavy."

To align the print cartridges:

1 Load plain paper in the printer. For help, see Load the paper.

2 Open the Lexmark Solution Center. For help, see Lexmark Solution Center.



3 From the Cartridges tab, click Align Cartridges.

Your printer prints an alignment test page and the Align Cartridges dialog box appears. Depending on the cartridges you have installed, the number of alignment patterns will vary.

Note: If the alignment page doesn't print, make sure you completely removed the tape and sticker from the print cartridges.



- 4 Each pattern has a number under it. Find the number under the darkest arrow. For example in alignment group A, number 3 is darkest.
- **5** In the Align Cartridges dialog box, type the pattern numbers from the printed test page.
- 6 Click OK.

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Preserving the print cartridges

To ensure the longest life from your print cartridge and optimum performance from your printer:

- Keep a new print cartridge in its packaging until you are ready to install it.
- Do not remove a print cartridge from the printer except to replace, clean, or store it in the cartridge storage unit (Lexmark Z13 printer only) or another airtight container. For more information, see Storing an extra print cartridge. The print cartridge will not print correctly if left exposed for an extended period of time.

Lexmark's printer warranty does not cover repair of failures or damage caused by a refilled cartridge. Lexmark does not recommend use of refilled cartridges. Refilling cartridges can affect print quality and cause damage to the printer. For best results, use Lexmark supplies.

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Storing an extra print cartridge

Note: This only applies to the Lexmark Z13 printer.

Attaching the print cartridge storage unit to the printer

- 1 Insert the tabs on the print cartridge storage unit into the slots on the back of your printer.
- **2** Snap the storage unit securely into place.





Inserting a print cartridge in the storage unit

- **1** Insert the extra print cartridge into the storage unit.
- **2** Push the cartridge down and then back to lock it into the storage unit.

Removing a print cartridge from the storage unit

- **1** Push the print cartridge down.
- **2** Pull the print cartridge toward you and out of the storage unit.

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Solving general printing problems

When you have a printing problem, first make sure:

- The power supply is plugged into the printer and a properly grounded electrical outlet.
- The printer is turned on, and there are no lights blinking. For help, see Understanding error messages and flashing lights.
- The USB cable is securely attached to both the computer and the printer.
- You disconnect your printer from hubs or other devices, such as a scanner or a fax machine. Then connect the printer directly to your computer.
- The printer driver is installed correctly. For help, see Solving printer software installation problems.
- The paper is loaded correctly. For help, see Load the paper.
- The printer is set as the default printer. For help, see **Printer is not queuing** documents properly.



Printing a test page

- 1 Open the Lexmark Solution Center. For help, see Lexmark Solution Center.
- **2** From the Cartridges tab, click Print a Test Page to verify that the printer is functioning properly.

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- If the test page prints, the printer software is communicating with the printer. Try printing your document again. If it still doesn't print, the operating system may not be sending the document to the printer software correctly.
- If the test page does not print:
 - Check the USB cable connections.
 - Check the power supply connections.
- Check that the printer daemon is running. For help, see **Restarting the printer** daemon.

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Restarting the printer daemon

Make sure lpd daemon is running. As root, type:

/etc/rc.d/init/lpd status

If lpd daemon is not running, as root, type the following at a command line to start the lpd daemon:

/usr/sbin/lpc restart all

or

/etc/rc.d/init.d/lpd stop

/etc/rc.d/init.d/lpd start



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Solving printer software installation problems

If the printer software does not install properly, a communications error message appears when you try to print. You may need to uninstall, and then reinstall the printer software.

Uninstalling the printer software

1 Open a terminal window.

2 Type the following at a command line: rpm -e filename

where *filename* is the name of the rpm file containing your software. For example: rpm -e lexmarkz23-33-1.0-1.

3 Continue with Installing the printer software.

Installing the printer software

Note: Before you begin, make sure gzip is loaded on your system.

- 1 Download the printer software from the Lexmark Web site at **www.lexmark.com**, or find the file on your computer.
- 2 Open the directory where you downloaded the zipped file. The file will have a name similar to CJLX13LE.tar.gz

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- 4 At the command line, type: tar -xvf filename.tar where *filename* is the name of the tarred file you just decompressed. For example: tar -xvf CJLX13LE.tar
- 5 At the command line, type: rpm -i filename where filename is the name of the RPM file. For example: rpm -i lexmarkz23-33-1.0-1.i386.rpm.

Note: The RPM program copies all printer software information to the directory /usr/local/lexmark/zxx/ where Zxx is your printer model. For example: /usr/local/lexmark/z23-z33.

- 6 Follow the instructions on your screen to complete the software installation.
- 7 Installing your printer involves installing and aligning the print cartridges. For help, see **Selecting the cartridge in the software**.



Understanding error messages and flashing lights

Use this section to help you understand the error messages from your printer software and the blinking lights on your printer.

Paper Jam message

If the Paper Feed light is blinking, you may have a paper jam. For help, see **Clearing paper misfeeds or jams**.

Ink Low message

A print cartridge is running out of ink. Purchase a new print cartridge. For help, see **Ordering supplies**. For help installing a new cartridge, see **Replacing a print cartridge**.

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The Paper Feed light is blinking

- If the printer is out of paper:
 - a Load paper. For help, see Load the paper.
 - **b** Press the Paper Feed button.
- If the paper is jammed, see Clearing paper misfeeds or jams.

The Power light is blinking

The print cartridge carrier is stalled.

- 1 Check your screen for error messages.
- **2** Turn the printer off.
- **3** Wait a few seconds, and turn the printer back on.











Resolving unsuccessful or slow printing

Click the topic that best describes your problem.

- Bidirectional communication problems
- Printer is plugged in but doesn't print
- Test page does not print

- Printer ejects a blank page after appearing to print
- Printer prints very slowly
- Printer is not queuing documents properly

Bidirectional communication problems

If your printer doesn't print, your printer and computer may not be communicating properly. The following events also indicate bidirectional communication problems:

- A message appears on your computer screen indicating that your printer cannot establish bidirectional communication with your computer.
- The print cartridge ink level indicators on the Cartridges tab are shaded.
- Error messages (such as Paper Out) and job progress information do not appear on the computer screen.





Before proceeding, verify that:

- The printer software has been installed correctly. For help, see Solving printer software installation problems.
- The USB cable is securely attached to both the printer and the computer.
- The printer is plugged into a properly grounded electrical outlet and is on.
- Remove any extra devices, such as a scanner or hub, and connect the printer directly to the USB port.

Printer is plugged in but doesn't print

Make sure:

- The printer is turned on.
- The paper is loaded correctly. For help, see **Basic printing**.
- Bidirectional communication is established between your printer and computer. For help, see Bidirectional communication problems.
- The printer is set as the default printer. For help, see Solving general printing problems.
- The print job is not being held in the print queue. For help, see **Printer is not queuing** documents properly.

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Try **Printing a test page**. If the test page prints, the printer is functioning properly. If it does not print, see **Test page does not print**.

Test page does not print

Make sure:

- The print cartridge is properly installed. For help, see **Replacing a print cartridge**.
- The printer is set as the default printer. For help, see **Solving general printing problems**.
- The paper is loaded correctly. For help, see Load the paper.

Printer ejects a blank page after appearing to print

Make sure:

- Your printer is set as the default printer. For help, see **Solving general printing problems**.
- You remove the sticker and transparent tape from the print cartridge. For help, see **Replacing a print cartridge**.
- Your print cartridge does not have clogged nozzles. Clean the print cartridge nozzles.



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Printer prints very slowly

- Close software applications not in use.
- Check the document you are printing. Photos and graphics may take longer to print than regular text.
- Choose Quick Print or Normal print quality for faster speed. Your document takes longer to print when you use a higher quality setting.
- Check your computer resources. Consider increasing the virtual memory for your computer or consider purchasing more random access memory (RAM).

Printer is not queuing documents properly

- Send the print job to the correct printer. For help, see Print your document.
- Check the name of your printer by looking at the names in the spool directory (/var/ spool/lpd) or in the printcap file (/etc/printcap).
- In the /*etc/printcap* file, make sure :lp is pointing to the correct port. For example, if your printer is attached to your first USB port, it is usually defined as /*dev/usb/usblp0*.

Note: You can only print to a USB port if your Linux kernel has USB support. For help, refer to your Linux documentation.



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- Make sure your printer is the default printer. The default printer is the one with *lp* in the first line of the entry for the printer in the */etc/printcap* file.
- Make sure lpd daemon is running. For help, see **Restarting the printer daemon**.



Clearing paper misfeeds or jams

Click the topic that best describes your problem.

- Paper misfeeds or multiple sheets feed through the printer
- The printer does not feed envelopes or specialty paper

• The printer has a paper jam

Paper misfeeds or multiple sheets feed through the printer

Make sure:

- Your paper is recommended for inkjet printers.
- You do not load too much paper in the sheet feeder. Depending on the thickness of your paper, the sheet feeder can hold up to 100 sheets of paper or 10 mm (0.39 in.).
- You do not force the paper down into the printer when you load it. For example, A4 size paper should extend above the top of the paper support. (Letter size paper should align with the top of the paper support.) Make sure the paper support is fully extended.
- The paper guide is against the left side of the paper.
- The paper guide does not cause the paper to bow in the sheet feeder.



- The printer is on a flat, level surface.
- Your settings are correct in the driver. For help, see Customize the print settings.

The printer does not feed envelopes or specialty paper

Make sure:

• Your printer will feed plain paper. For help, see Load the paper.

If regular paper feeds without problems, load the envelopes or specialty paper vertically against the right side of the sheet feeder. Make sure the paper guide is against the left side of the envelopes. For help, see **Load the envelopes**.

- The appropriate envelope or specialty paper size is selected in the printer software. For help, see **Printing ideas**.
- You are using a specialty paper or envelope size supported by your printer.
- Your software application is designed to print envelopes. For help, check the documentation that came with your software application.
- Your stack of paper in the sheet feeder does not exceed 10 mm (0.39 in.) in height.
- You loaded the envelopes, or specialty paper correctly. For help, see Load the envelopes or Load the paper.
- If the envelope or specialty paper is jammed, see The printer has a paper jam.

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The printer has a paper jam

If the paper is lodged too far into the printer and can't be removed:

1 Turn the printer off.

- **2** Turn the printer back on.
- **3** If the printer does not eject the page:
 - **a** Turn the printer off.
 - **b** Pull firmly on the paper to remove it. If you cannot reach the paper, raise the front cover and pull the paper out of the printer.
 - c Close the front cover.
 - **d** Turn the printer on.
- 4 Resend your document to print.



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Solving specialty paper problems

Use this section to help you solve problems with specialty paper.

Glossy or photo papers or transparencies stick together

- Make sure the paper is loaded correctly and the correct settings are selected in the printer software. For help, see **Printing photos** or **Printing transparencies**.
- Remove each page as it exits the printer and let it dry before stacking.
- Use a photo paper or transparency designed for inkjets.

Transparencies or photos contain white lines

- Select a higher Quality/Speed setting, such as Better or Best. For help, see **Customize the print settings**. As you increase the print Quality/Speed, the document takes longer to dry. Too much handling before they dry completely can cause smearing.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.

Envelopes or specialty papers misfeed

See, The printer does not feed envelopes or specialty paper
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Improving print quality

Clean the print cartridge nozzles

Cleaning the print cartridge nozzles forces ink through the nozzles to clear any that are clogged. A test page prints so you can see if the cleaning process is a success.

Clean the print nozzles when:

- Characters are not printing completely.
- White dashes appear in graphics or printed text.



- Print is smudged or too dark.
- Colors do not print correctly.

To clean the print nozzles:

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- 1 Load plain paper in the printer. For help, see Load the paper.
- 2 From your desktop, open the Lexmark Solution Center. For help, see Lexmark Solution Center.
- 3 Click Cartridges.
- 4 Click Clean Print Nozzles.





The printer prints a nozzle test pattern similar to the one shown:







When you install a:	These purge lines print:
Black cartridge	1 black purge line
Color cartridge	3 purge lines: cyan, magenta, and yellow
Black and color cartridge	4 purge lines: cyan, magenta, yellow, and black

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Note: If the correct number of purge lines did not print, replace your print cartridge. For help, see Replacing a print cartridge.

5 Compare the lines above the purge lines to the lines below. Look for a break in the lines. A broken line indicates clogged nozzles.

If the second set of lines has breaks, clean the print nozzles up to two more times.

If the lines are still broken, Wipe the print nozzles and contacts.



Wipe the print nozzles and contacts

If print quality does not improve after you **Clean the print cartridge nozzles**, there may be dried ink on the print nozzles or contacts.

- 1 Remove the print cartridge. For help, see Removing the used cartridge.
- **2** Dampen a clean, lint-free cloth with water.
 - **a** Hold the cloth against the nozzles for about three seconds. Gently blot and wipe in one direction.

 b Use another clean section of cloth.
 Hold the damp cloth against the contacts for about three seconds.
 Gently blot and wipe in one direction.



3 Reinstall the print cartridge, and then clean the nozzles again. For help, see **Clean the print cartridge nozzles**.

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Print is too dark or smudged

- Make sure the paper is straight and not wrinkled.
- Let the ink dry before handling the paper.
- Make sure the Type setting in the printer software matches the type of paper loaded.
- Select a lower Quality/Speed setting, such as Quick Print or Normal. For help, see **Customize the print settings**.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.

Vertical straight lines are not smooth

- Select a higher Quality/Speed setting. For help, see **Customize the print settings**.
- Try Aligning the print cartridges.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.



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Print smears on the page

- When loading the paper, make sure the print side is facing you. For help, see **Load the paper**.
- Remove each page as it exits and let it dry before stacking.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.

Printed pages have alternating bands of light and dark print

- Select a higher Quality/Speed setting, such as Better or Best. For help, see **Customize the print settings**.
- Make sure you have established bidirectional communication between your printer and computer. For help, see Bidirectional communication problems.



Print quality is poor at the edges of the page

Like other printers, your printer cannot print on the extreme left, right, top, or bottom edges of a page. Here are the minimum margins for your printer:

Margin	Minimum setting
Left and Right	 6.35 mm (0.25 in.) for most paper sizes 3.37 mm (0.133 in.) for A4
Тор	1.7 mm (0.067 in.)
Bottom	 12.7 mm (0.5 in.) for most print jobs 19.0 mm (0.75 in.) for Maximum quality

Printed characters are improperly formed or misaligned

- Try Aligning the print cartridges.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.

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Colors on the printout are faded or they differ from colors on the screen

- A print cartridge may be out or low on ink. Try **Replacing a print cartridge**.
- Use a different brand of paper. Every paper brand accepts ink differently and prints with slight color variations.
- Your printer may have bidirectional communication problems. For help, see **Bidirectional communication problems**.
- Clean the print cartridge nozzles.

Characters are missing or unexpected

- Make sure your printer software is selected as the default printer. For help, see **Solving general printing problems**.
- Your printer may have bidirectional communication problems. For help, see **Bidirectional communication problems**.

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Reducing ink usage

Choose a lower print quality:

- **1** From Printer Settings, choose the Quality/Copies tab.
- **2** From the Quality/Speed area, select a lower Quality/Speed setting. As you lower the print quality, the amount of ink you use decreases.
- 3 Click OK.

To reduce the amount of color ink you use, print color documents in black and white. For help, see **Printing color images in black and white**.
